Then Owlie drove home and went to bed.

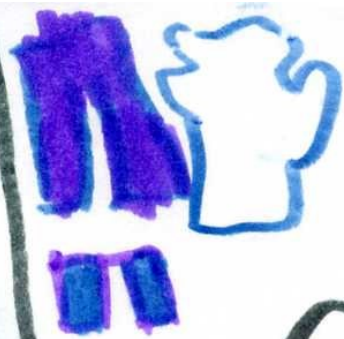
