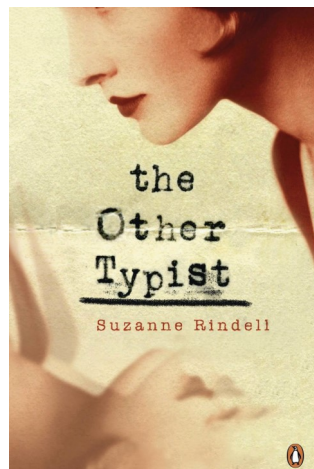


**Suzanne Rindell's *The Other Typist*

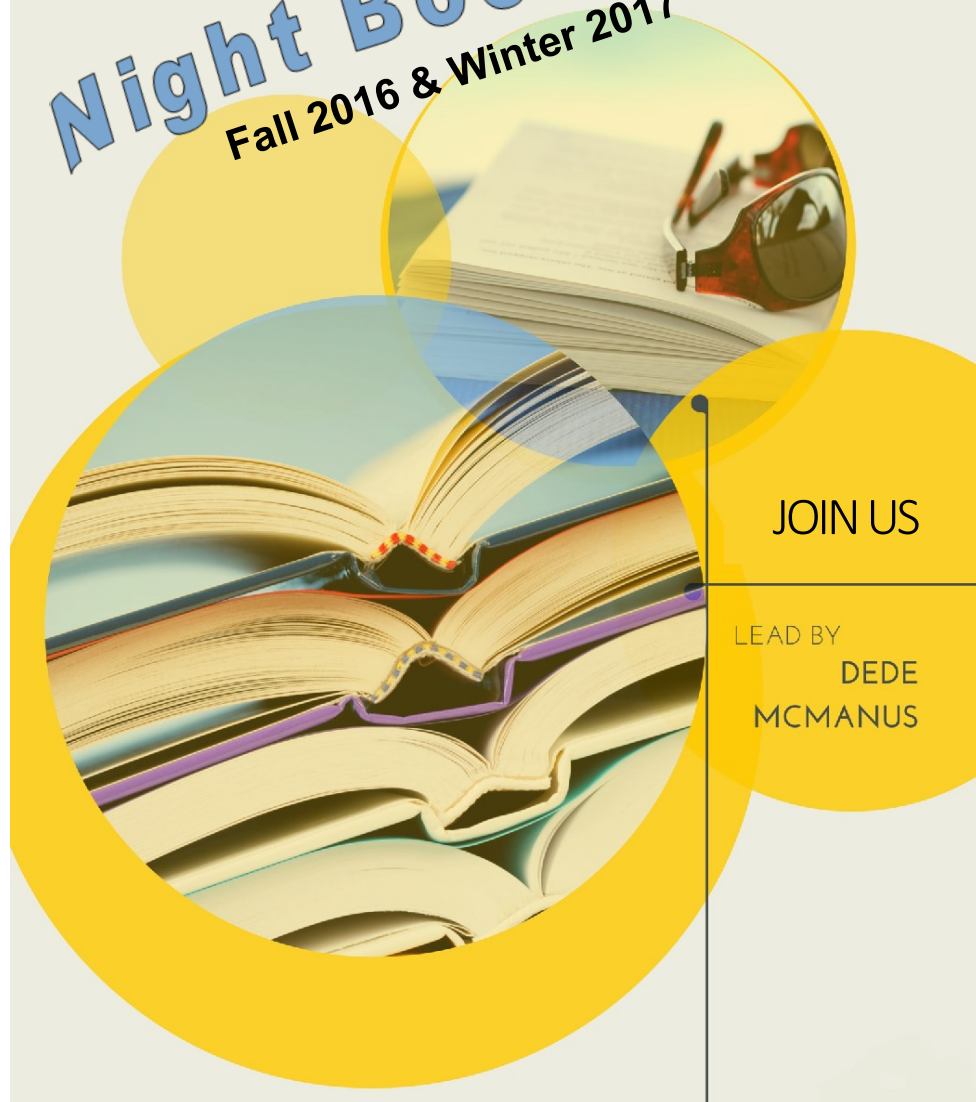

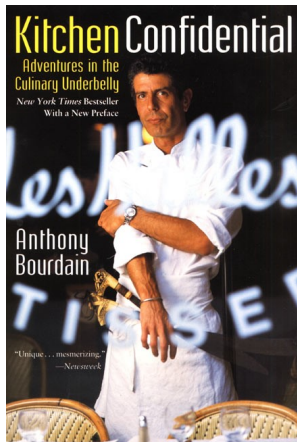

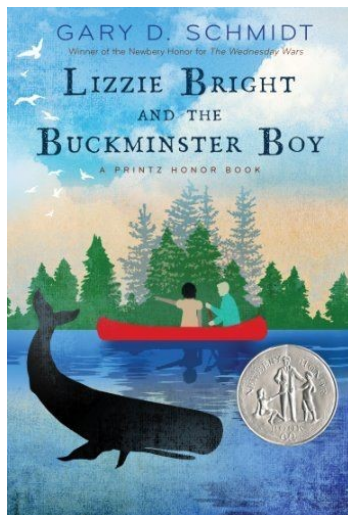
***Kitchen Confidential:

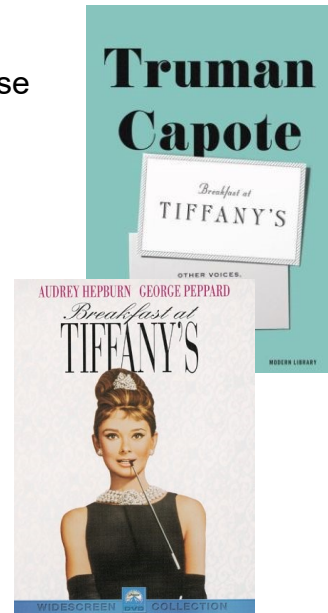
***Breakfast at Tiffany's* by Truman Capote

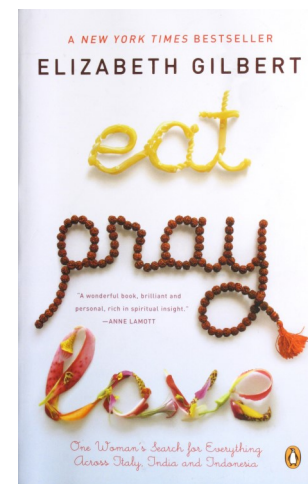
