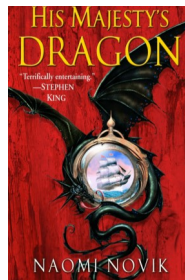


2014. A mother and her two small children must make their way down a river, blindfolded. One wrong choice and they will die. And something is following them —but is it man, animal, or monster?

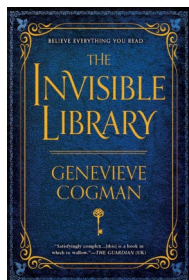

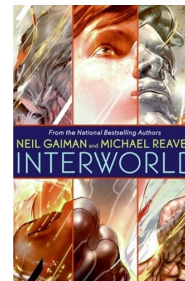
